"Yup!"

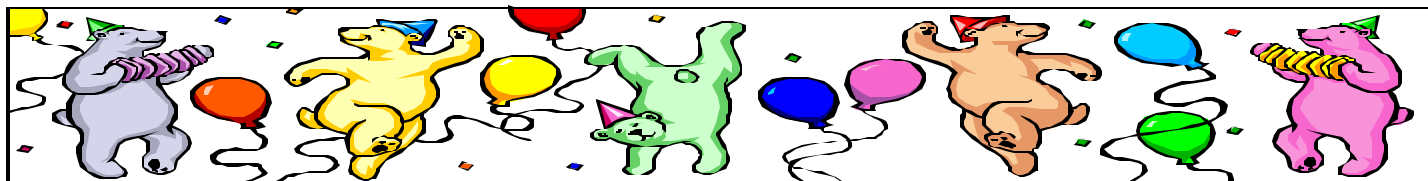

We can speed her up by getting her to all sorts of efficient things but we also must remember that Gertie is seldom more than a minute or two late and always apologises when she recognises what has happened right?"
